contact details of the applicant. The Act also mandates that public authorities respond to the application within thirty days from the date of receipt¹².

The evaluation of the working of the Right to Information (RTI) Act in Tamil Nadu has revealed its significant impact on promoting transparency, accountability, and citizen empowerment in governance. The Act, since its inception, has served as a powerful tool for citizens to access information and actively engage with public authorities, thereby strengthening democratic ideals and promoting good governance.

Through this comprehensive analysis, we have identified several strengths of the RTI Act in Tamil Nadu. It has empowered citizens to seek information, leading to enhanced public scrutiny of government actions and decisions. The Act has exposed instances of corruption and malpractices, enabling corrective actions and fostering a culture of transparency and integrity in public administration. Additionally, the RTI Act has led to improved service delivery in various sectors, ensuring better utilization of public resources and efficient implementation of government schemes.

Moreover, encouraging proactive disclosure by public authorities and ensuring robust protection for whistleblowers will further enhance transparency and accountability in governance.

In conclusion, the Right to Information Act has been transformative, making governance more inclusive and responsive to citizen needs. Through a robust and effective implementation of the RTI Act in Tamil Nadu, citizens can continue to play an active role in shaping their government, holding public authorities accountable, and contributing to the state's progress and development. By addressing the identified challenges and adopting the recommended measures, Tamil Nadu can reinforce its commitment to transparency, accountability, and citizen-centric governance, creating a brighter and more participatory future for all its citizens.

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
